He is full Professor of Architecture and Urbanism at Kennesaw State University College of Architecture and Construction Management and served as Hyde Chair of Excellence at the University of Nebraska College of Architecture and the James Tittle '49 Visiting Scholar and Professor at Texas A and M University, College of Architecture. His internationally award-winning firm; Lightroom, has designed many projects in Atlanta and works in disciplines including modern architecture, historic preservation, film production, graphic design, branding and websites. He is past president of AIA Atlanta and AIA Georgia and received their highest honors; the Rothschild Medal and the Ivan Allen medal. He received the National AIA/ACSA Educator of the Year medal and the National ACSA Distinguished Professor Medal; one of the highest honors an educator can receive from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture and served as Chancellor of the College of the ACSA Distinguished Professors. He is currently serving as part of the editorial and curatorial team for the Biennale di Venezia Italian Pavilion, which opened in August 2021 in Venice, Italy. He recently delivered a keynote address at Ars Electronica in Linz, Austria which is one of the most respected design conferences in Europe.
